Above is a snapshot of our current church assets. The administrative and maintenance costs to run the church are approximately \$250,000 per year. After pledges, gifts, and rental income we still anticipate an annual deficit of \$50,000 this year. If this trend continues, it is estimated that BUCC could go through its remaining reserves in 5 years or less.

Lighting the Advent Wreath Candles

Reader 1: On this fourth Sunday of Advent, we light the candles of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

Reader 2: Love not yet fulfilled, but love already made flesh among us. Reader 3: For Emmanuel is coming—God's heart beating in human life.

Congregational Song: "One Candle Is Lit"

Start singing when the first candle is lit

Come Surely, Lord Jesus, as dawn follows night, our hearts long to greet you, as roses, the light. Salvation, draw near us, our vision engage. One candle is lit for the hope of the age.

Come quickly, shalom, teach us how to prepare for a gift that compels us with justice to care. Our spirits are restless till sin and war cease. One candle is lit for the reign of God's peace.

Come, festively sing while a waiting the birth, join angels in dancing from heaven to earth. Wave banners of good news, lift high thankful praise. One candle is lit for the joy of thsee days

Come, wander where lion and lamb gently play, where evil is banished and fiath takes the day, a babe in a manger to fool the world's eyes. One candle is lit for God's loving surprise.

<u>First Reading: Julian of Norwich (All Shall Be Well: A Modern-Language Version of the Revelation of Julian of Norwich)</u>

"Jesus wants us to understand four things: First, that He Himself is our ground, the soil from which we grow, the foundation on which we are built. Second, that He guards us and keeps us safe when we are in the midst of sin, when our own choices allow our enemies to surround us, when we do not even realize our own need. Third, that He guards us with care and kindness, showing us where we have gone astray. And fourth, that His presence is always with us, and His loving gaze never wavers, for He wants us to turn back to Him and become united with Him in love, as He is with us."

Second Reading: Matthew 1:18-25

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit.

Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly.

But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.

She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

"Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us."

When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife,

but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.
