Pastor's Ponderings

Becoming the Church We Are Describing

January is a time when many of us feel the pull to take stock—of what has been, what is, and what we hope might yet be shaped. In the life of the church, that work often shows up in the process of creating or revising a congregational profile. It can sound technical or distant, but at its heart, it is deeply spiritual work.

To name our strengths honestly is not self-congratulation; it is gratitude. To acknowledge our weaknesses is not failure; it is wisdom. Profile-building asks us to tell the truth about who we are—our history, our gifts, our challenges, and our longings—so that the story we offer is both faithful and real. That kind of truth-telling has the power to reshape us, not just describe us.

This work is not simply about preparing for a future settled minister, as important as that is. It is about living now into the hopes and vision we claim. When we clarify who we are and who we are becoming, we begin practicing those commitments in real time—strengthening what is healthy, tending what needs care, and aligning our life together with the values we profess.

In that sense, the profile is not a document we complete and set aside. It is a mirror and a guide, inviting us to grow into the congregation we hope to be. We do not wait to become that church; we begin becoming it together, now.

Who Are Our Neighbors? An Invitation

One of the most important questions before us as a congregation is simple but essential: Who are our neighbors?

Not only who lives near us, but who we are called to know, listen to, and engage alongside as a vital presence in our community.

This winter, the SPIRE Center is offering a six-session online Place-Based Ministry Workshop (Jan 12–Mar 2) that directly supports this work. Grounded in asset-based community development and a Beloved Community framework, the workshop helps participants move beyond charity toward meaningful partnership and community resilience. Each participant or team will come away with a practical community engagement plan rooted in their local context.

I am hoping that 3–7 people from our congregation will participate in this workshop to help us more faithfully answer the congregational profile question, "Who are our neighbors?" This learning will not only deepen our understanding of our setting, but also help set us in motion as a ministry with our neighbors rather than simply for them.

The workshop is facilitated by Rev. Michael Anthony Howard, Minister of Faith in Action for the Living Water Association, and takes place on Monday evenings via Zoom: January 12, 26; February 2, 9, 23; and March 2.
