Pastor's Ponderings......

Telling the Story Clearly, Living the Story Together

This time of year draws many of us into gatherings where the stories come easily. Someone says, "Remember when...," and suddenly we're filling in the details for one another the way only long-time friends and family can. Those moments remind us that community is held together not just by the memories we carry, but by the way we communicate them—how we speak, how we listen, how we stay connected.

Advent gives us its own version of this. When Mary arrives at Elizabeth's home, the scene is simple but full of meaning: one speaks, the other responds, and in that exchange both are strengthened. Their shared words become a sanctuary where each is recognized, encouraged, and reminded of God's work in their lives. And theirs is only part of the picture. The story moves forward through a whole network of voices and visions—an angel announcing, Joseph discerning in a dream, shepherds sharing what they've seen. Again and again, God's love comes close enough to be heard, close enough to be held. Communication isn't an accessory to the incarnation; it is woven into the very way God draws near.

That same pattern shapes our congregational life. When we say we are an Open and Affirming church, we are describing more than a position—we are naming a practice. Inclusion is expressed in the ways we communicate, how we make space for one another, and how we ensure people have what they need to participate fully.

This is why even something as ordinary as our church calendar matters. An accurate calendar is not simply administrative; it is a sign of our desire to include others and part of the hospitality we extend to one another. When meetings, rehearsals, or events are scheduled or changed, making sure the calendar reflects that helps us stay grounded in clarity rather than confusion.

So I ask all our leaders and ministry teams: Please ensure that the gatherings you are planning appear on the calendar, and let us know when a group is not meeting so it can be removed. These small steps make a real difference in how we live our commitments together.

And another request for all of us: Please take a moment to look at your information in our Breeze system and make sure it's current—especially your photograph. A recent picture helps us learn names, recognize one another, and welcome newer folks into the life of the congregation. It also supports something we all desire: to reach new people, include them fully, and make it easier for them to feel at home among us.

As we move toward Christmas, we remember a God who chooses to communicate love in ways we can see and hear and hold. May our life together echo that same clarity and care in this season and beyond.

FROM THE MINISTRIES OF BUCC

Christmas Eve 4:00pm Christmas Eve Candlelight Service This year, after listening carefully to the congregation's input from our Christmas Eve survey and the thoughtful comments many of you shared, we will be trying something new: our Christmas Eve Candlelight Service will begin at 4:00 pm.

The responses we received pointed us in this direction. While 5:00 pm was the strongest preference among the listed options, many people shared that an earlier time would make participation more accessible—because of evening gatherings, winter driving concerns, the needs of children, the pace of the day, or simply wanting space to breathe in the middle of a full season. Several also noted that gathering earlier helps more people of all ages and abilities arrive and return home safely.

Choosing 4:00 pm gives us the chance to worship together while there is still some light, and then move gently into candlelight as the day turns toward evening. It offers flexibility for those whose Christmas Eve traditions happen later in the night, and support for those whose schedules or responsibilities make a later service difficult. Just as importantly, it reflects our ongoing commitment to listen to one another and to choose practices that help the greatest number of us participate fully.

We recognize this is a change from our usual pattern, and we are treating this year as an opportunity to try something new—something shaped by the voices and needs of our community. We hope it creates room for many in our congregation and the wider community to pause, gather, sing, and receive the promise at the heart of the Christmas story: that Love draws near to us, meets each of us exactly where we are, and welcomes us with grace.

A Shared Table, A Single Loaf- For generations, our communion table has held the promise that in Christ we are made one body, gathered and nourished by God's grace. In recent years, as gluten-free options became more readily available, we have been able to embody that promise more fully. Beginning in December, the loaf used for communion at Brecksville UCC will be gluten-free.


This change reflects both hospitality and theology. When glutenfree bread was rare, congregations often provided a separate option so that most could partake. But the symbol of "one body, one bread" is most deeply expressed when the whole congregation can share from a single loaf. By preparing a glutenfree loaf for all, no one is set apart, and all may receive from the same table with the same blessing.

We hope this practice strengthens our shared witness to inclusivity, welcome, and the unity Christ has already given us.
